REGATHERING

Using the word REGATHERING is wrong because for the last 12 months we have been gathering as a church online via YouTube and Zoom.

We had a brief spell in September when some were able to come and gather in the Sanctuary for worship (but this involved a whole variety of restrictions that had to be followed). It would also be true to say that for much of the Pandemic the building itself has constantly been used, because it has been a base for us to help support the local community through ventures like foodbank, CAP and Redeeming our Community.

Since the Prime Minister set out in February a roadmap for the country to begin to resume normal life, the leadership has been reviewing and considering what this looks like for us as a church.

It's important to say that this needs to be OUR RoadMap, because it needs to be what is right for Clarence Park Baptist Church, based on our members, our congregation, our building and our resources.

OUR Roadmap and not that of others

It is important then, not to read this document comparing what we are doing to other churches or groups, but also, to accept that other groups and activities may not follow our plan. As we say, every group has different needs and so within the guidelines move through these next few months and years in a different way.

This document also helps you to understand that Guidelines issued by the Government and Baptist Union change regularly; meaning that the advice for church gatherings is updated frequently. So please be aware that, although we are looking at dates and basing our plan on what is currently allowed, this may need to change as we respond to new guidance or wider issues nationally caused by the pandemic.

In preparing this information the leadership is aware that our congregation are all in different places emotionally. Some of our fellowship have had both their vaccination jabs, some just one and some have not yet been called to have their first one. Some people are still isolating, some have not ventured out of their homes for 12 months and some have had their lives personally turned completely upside down as they mourn the loss of those who they love.

Coming back into our building for worship, for ministry and for learning more about God needs to be a process that takes time. It has taken us almost a year to understand lockdown and so we need to be generous in the time that we give ourselves in preparing to come back.

PREPARING TO MOVE FORWARD

As we look forward to returning for face-to-face activities there are a number of things to be considered.

During the end of March and into April we need to reform and recruit volunteers onto some of our different teams. During the last year some people have stepped down from their previous roles and those vacancies now need to be filled.

If you are willing to step up onto some of our teams then please make yourself known to us by returning the form at the end of this document or by completing it online via Google docs.

REFORM AND RECRUIT TEAMS

The initial teams that need to be reactivated for face-to-face worship are:

PA / AV / STREAMING TEAM

These teams have not been in post for over 12 months. Members need to be contacted to ensure that they are able and willing to continue in these roles, people need to be retrained in order to regain their confidence in using the equipment, new members need to be trained and we need to hold a few trials of the equipment and their functions.

WELCOME / STEWARDING TEAMS

A key part of coming back will be to make sure that we are able to welcome people safely into the building, plus that we ensure that they are made to feel at home.

MUSIC TEAMS

Musicians and singers need to be approached and arrangements made for how they will operate within the guidelines.

CONNECT GROUPS

Hosts and leaders for CONNECT bible study groups to be getting ready for meeting again

Please note: From 29th March 6 people or two households can meet outdoors, including in private gardens. We are advised that this rule at present does **NOT** allow for any church gatherings unless outside and on church premises.

until these rules are changed, we are currently advised that HOUSE GROUPS / CONNECT / CHURCH GROUPS meeting in Gardens or in public places for worship are not allowed.

Our next stage sees us focus on our regathering for worship and exploring ways and places for prayer.

Our plan is to be gaining gradual momentum towards fully coming back together in small, safe but practical steps.

The 17th May is the next planned date for the government to announce if as a nation we are moving onto the next stage of unlocking. If this happens it will create further opportunities for people to reconnect with one another outside of the church building and grounds.

Pastorally these groups will be essential for supporting one another emotionally through the change that is required to be comfortable with meeting together again. For many in our church this will be a particularly difficult time as we transition back into the new community life, both in the church but also in our town.

Therefore, please take the opportunity, where the rules allow, to meet outside with others for prayer, walks and support.



SUNDAY SERVICES

- To remain online but LIVE streamed from the church with only those involved in the service present (leader, speaker, worship team, technical team etc...)

STAGE 2

This month we plan for a congregation to be present for our live streams on Sundays. If all goes to the government's plan then they hope to announce that on June 21st all social distancing rules will be lifted. It is still not clear if this change will apply to indoors, to face coverings and if indoor singing will be allowed.

For most of the month bringing a congregation back will mean that we need to follow the same rules as we used last September.

- The current social distancing rules will need to be followed.
 We will announce the exact details of these for households /
 bubbles etc. once the 17th May announcement and guidelines
 are issued and are interpreted by the Baptist Union GB.
- 2. Space will be limited, and so seats will need to be booked
- 3. There will be one way in and one way out
- 4. Face coverings will need to be worn
- 5. The congregation will not be allowed to sing
- 6. Refreshments will not be served
- 7. There will be no Sunday Club and children will be expected to stay within their household

STAGE 3

Government ministers have said that they will make an announcement on 21st June. If all has gone to their plan, they are hoping to announce the lifting of social distancing restrictions.

We will of course still need to wait to know if there are any requirements for indoors relating to face coverings, singing and the serving of refreshments.

We hope that by July we will return to gathering together fully. However, we are also aware that many people will, if allowed, be wanting to travel to see family etc.... plus, we will be getting used to being together as a full congregation.

Therefore, through July and August our services will remain all-age and will be of a reasonable length of time.

GATHERED No Longer SCATTERED

A new school term in September will mark the end of the summer holiday season and in church life is usually a time to focus on a new season as groups and ministries start their new sessions.

Having allowed us time to regather in the previous few months in September. We will take some time as a church to come together to remember those who are unable to come and worship with us. For some this will be because of health or age, but there are also those who have been called to glory during the pandemic. It will be important for us as a church to acknowledge the loss in our church family of those who we love.

Alongside this, we will also come with thanksgiving that God has brought us through this unprecedented time as we now begin to refocus our minds on building and seeing the kingdom of God come here on earth, just as it is in heaven.

REBOOTING GROUPS / MINISTRIES

Over a number of months, we have talked about groups and ministries not just restarting to what they were before the pandemic, but rebooting or upgrading when they are ready to recommence.

In some cases, some groups might not reboot at all, but instead begin from scratch with a new purpose and ethos to serve those to whom they seek to minister.

It is not our plan to request groups reboot by a certain date, but instead we want this to be an organic process.

Therefore, groups need to consider if they are ready and when they are ready, alongside considering their purpose and vision for rebooting and how the group fits into the life and vision of CPBC.

To facilitate this when they feel they are ready, <u>ALL</u> groups should approach the leadership who can then work with them to see how they fit into the church vision. Consideration also needs to be given to:

- 1. How does the group fit into the concept of WORSHIP God, GROW together and SERVE Others? How will they guide people to other stages?
- 2. What are the current regulations required relating to the group? (e.g. what, at the time of discussion, is permissible under government guidelines?)
- 3. What restrictions would need to be in place to conform to any national guidelines?
- 4. Has a satisfactory risk assessment been completed?
- 5. Is a leader willing to take on responsibility for ensuring that government guidelines are adhered to?
- 6. How does that group fit into the use of the church building and being covid secure?
- 7. Have they got the support of their members to restart and do they have enough leaders? Are there enough church members to support the running of the group?

OTHER INFORMATION
